Materials	Activity	Discussion	Outputs	Extended Outcomes
<p>-Pictures of a soldier, teacher, judge, friend, pledge of allegiance <i>or</i> Hats/clothing to represent the above words and have volunteers model.</p> <p>-Paper</p> <p>-Markers, crayons, etc.</p>	<p>-Write the word HONOR on the board or on a sign.</p> <p>-Ask for volunteers to suggest what the word HONOR means.</p> <p>-After a few suggestions, explain to the students that you will all work together to discover the meaning of honor.</p> <p>-Show the picture of the soldier and ask what hand signals do people sometime show to those in the military.</p> <p>-Show the picture of the teacher. What are you supposed to do in the classroom to answer a question?</p> <p>-Show the picture of a judge. What do people do when he/she walks into the courtroom?</p> <p>-Show the picture of the friend(s). What do you do when you see a friend(s) across the room, etc.?</p> <p>-Show the picture of the Pledge of Allegiance. What do you do when you say the Pledge? Why?</p> <p>-Draw a situation where you are honoring another person or group</p>	<p>-What does the word HONOR mean to you?</p> <p>-After discussing the pictures, what do these gestures or hand signals (wave, salute, raise hand, hand on heart) mean?</p> <p>-How does that show or represent HONOR to that person or representative symbol?</p> <p>-How can you show HONOR to your family? Friends? At school?
